World War I dramatically reshaped the contours of Connecticut society economically, socially, and politically. The recent digitization of World War I-era Connecticut newspapers by the Connecticut Digital Newspaper Project revealed stories from the home front culled from the *Norwich Bulletin*, the *Bridgeport Evening Farmer*, and the *Bridgeport Times*. This presentation will add detail to some of the standard historical themes used to explore the domestic impact and tensions of the war. Articles, editorials, advertisements, and reviews from these newspapers, one Democratic and one Republican, will give life to this conflicted era in the state's development and suggest topics that have not yet been fully researched.
